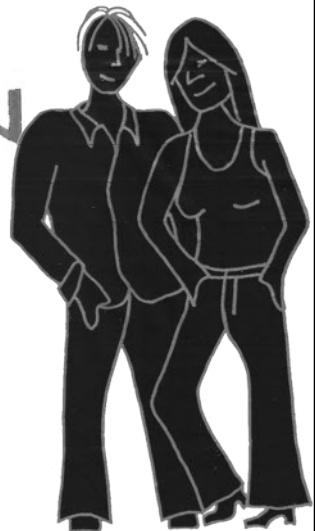

INTRODUCING KEYNSHAM TOWN

Keynsham Town Football Club is now over 110 years old, having been formed in 1896. In the early days it played at the "Hams" and then moved to "Gaston" in 1910. In 1925 the club played in Park Road and then moved again in 1930 to a pitch on Charlton Road. All these grounds have now been built on and there is no evidence of them. In 1939 the club was disbanded for the duration of the Second World War and was reformed in 1945 when the club found its new home at Crown Fields, where it has played ever since. It was due to the foresight of Roy Neal and Ken Dowling and the Committee at that time that the ground is left in trust to ensure that football can be played for the generations to come.

The main clubhouse was built in the 1970's with new dressing rooms added in 1984 and floodlights in 1989. In recent years the clubhouse has been upgraded and most recently the seats have been replaced, incidentally from the old Williams Stand at Ashton Gate, home of Bristol City Football Club.

The club first played in the Bristol & District League and progressed to the Bristol Premier Combination. The club then moved into the Somerset County League and into the Western League in 1974. The club then found themselves in the first division of the Western League when that league was formed in season 1975/6 but returned to the Premiership in 1978/9 when

Town finished as champions and then spent 5 years at the higher level only to find themselves in Division 1 for the start of season 1983/4. The Town then had a barren spell and it did not return to the top flight until 1997, finishing runners up to Melksham Town but the yoyo affect kicked in again two seasons later when the Town again returned to Division 1 only to return again in 2000 finishing runners up to Team Bath. The Town again find themselves in Division 1 this season and will be actively trying to return to the Premiership as quickly as possible.

Away from the first team the Town were developing their football club with the introduction of a reserve side in 1987, currently playing football in the First Division of the Somerset County League. The most noticeable achievement was the winning of the Somerset Senior Cup in 2003, the first time in 45 years, beating Westlands at Clevedon's Hand Stadium.

In 1988 an Under 18 Youth team was formed, competing in the Somerset Floodlight Youth League and in 2006/7 got promoted to the First Division of this league and to complete the circle an "A" team was formed in 1993 to compete in the Bath & District League. Both these sides were formed to support the growing number of players from within the Club's successful youth section and to provide that important step between junior and adult football.

INTRODUCING KEYNSHAM TOWN (cont)

The Town's junior section has over 10 sides playing competitive football in the Hanham Minor League and Avon Youth League with the 7's 8's and 9's playing friendlies on a regular basis. Old club stalwarts, Steve Nicholls and Martin Cole run a minis session every Saturday morning for children as young as 4 to get an introduction to the beautiful game.

The Town see the progress of its junior club as the keystone to the club's future development and playing success of the senior club with the sights set firmly on the local community for its inspiration and future success.

Ladies football came to Keynsham in 1993 and the Town Ladies FC represents the club in the FA Nation-

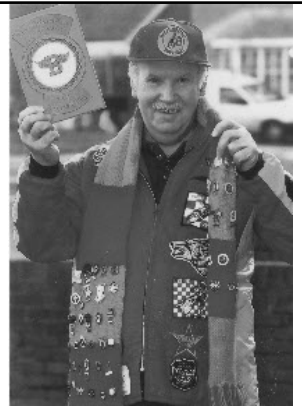
wide Women's Premier League - Southern Division and competes alongside such clubs as West Ham, Millwall and Southampton. With a reserve side playing in the South West Women's League First Division and junior sides in the Bristol Girls League.

With all the teams within the Town family we have over 25 teams playing regularly for the Club. With a club of such size and diversity, it was an honour to be awarded a Community Development Club, the highest level of the FA's Charter Standard initiative, something the club treasures and has set its stall out to operate under the ethos of the Charter.

Visitors Nailsea United were out of their blocks much quicker than the blues and after only fourteen minutes they had a significant two goal lead.

Ten minutes into the game James Springett gave the visitors the lead with a superb shot and four minutes later keeper Dave Sowden was again given no chance with a superb left foot shot from the much travelled Ryan King.

Nailsea continued to look the better side and in the 31st minute Sowden blocked a fierce shot from James Lee. Ten minutes later Sowden did well when he raced off his line to save at the feet of the dangerous King. Just before half time Guy Burns produced Minehead's best effort of the half when his fierce shot was blocked by the keeper.

After the interval the Blues looked a completely different team and for long periods they dominated play with Andy Hall and Stefan Phillips both seeing their efforts fly just wide of the target. In the 68th minute the Blues' efforts were rewarded when Guy Burns turned cleverly just inside the penalty area to reduce the arrears with a low shot.

James Browning then raced clear on the left only to shoot wide and just as the blues looked likely to equalise Ryan King broke clear of their defence with eighteen minutes remaining to beat Sowden with another superb shot.

Minehead continued to attack with great effort but the two goal deficit was too much to overcome.

MANGOTSFIELD UNITED RESERVES 3 MINEHEAD 3

Minehead's spasmodic start to their first season in the Somerset County League continued last Saturday when they outplayed their hosts in the first half, but came away with just a point after being under the cosh for the final quarter of the game.

With less than a minute on the clock, after a foul on the lively Guy Burns, Stefan Phillips' inch perfect free kick found full back Rob Gurnett at the far post, whose side footed effort beat home keeper Sam Alexander from close range. With Minehead looking the more confident side it was against the run of play that a mix up in the centre of the blues defence allowed top scorer Rico Best to level the score.

Minehead were not content to sit on their laurels and ten minutes later a deft centre from captain Andy Hall found Luke Bloys in a good position and his left footed half volley put the visitors back in front.

For the remainder of the half, it was Minehead who looked likeliest to add to the scoreline, with Bloys seeing three efforts from the edge of the box go close. Guy Burns was causing problems and a mazy run which took him past several defenders brought a fine save from Alexander. Then from a long Dave Sowden goal kick another fine run

from Burns resulted in his cross being met with full force by Andy Hall's header but it was straight at Alexander and the competent keeper manage to keep it out. After another close effort from Bloys, Guy Burns got his reward for a productive first half when another jinking run ended with his right footed shot from the edge of the box beating the overworked Alexander.

The second half was a different story however with the home side pressing hard from the start. Centre forward Wilson brought a good save from Sowden just before the hour mark, but the blues responded with Burns producing an equally good save from Alexander. After 68 minutes substitute Keary volleyed home from a deep corner and the home side were back in the game. With a quarter of an hour remaining Carey shot wide when well placed. The blues remained under pressure for the final ten minutes and it was no surprise when Best doubled his own tally for the match with an equaliser four minutes from time.

The blues managed to survive fairly serious home pressure to come away with one point when after 45 minutes three seemed in the bag.

About The FA Vase

The FA Vase effectively replaced The FA Amateur Cup in 1974. In that year the FA Council had decided to abolish the official distinction between 'amateur' and 'professional' footballers and this meant the end of The Amateur Cup and Amateur Internationals involving England.

220 clubs entered The Vase in its first season but they didn't include those clubs which had dominated in The Amateur Cup. Enfield, Hendon, Dagenham, Skelmersdale United and others at their level were immediately allocated to The FA Trophy.

For the first time in history, small clubs - even village clubs - had the chance of playing in a national final at Wembley. The first Vase Finalists were Hoddesdon Town from the Spartan



League and Epsom & Ewell from the Surrey Senior League. The Hertfordshire side edged home 2-1 before a crowd of 9,000.

Even a competition as democratic as The Vase had its 'elite' clubs in the early years. Billericay Town, initially of the Essex Senior League, won The Vase in 1976, 1977 and 1979. Halesowen Town, then in the West Midlands League, also appeared in three Finals. They lost by the only goal to VS Rugby in 1983, scored by Ian Crawley who also scored the goal that won The Trophy for Telford United in '89, but beat Fleetwood Town in '85 and Southall in '86.

Until two years ago the record attendance for any Vase match was the 26,489 who saw the drawn 1989 Final between Sudbury Town and Tamworth on a warm afternoon at Wembley.





Tamworth won the replay 3-0 at Peterborough and Ian Moores, a former Division One player with Tottenham Hotspur, scored one of the goals.

The Vase competition is now in its 35th season. There have been 28 Finals at Wembley, two at Villa Park and St Andrews and one each at Upton Park and White Hart Lane. 29 different clubs have got their hands on The Vase donated by former FA Councillor Frank Adams. Billericay lead the



way with three wins, followed by Brigg Town, Halesowen Town and Tiverton Town with two.

Aficionados of The Vase competition tend to rate the 1992 Final between Wimborne Town and Guiseley as the best so far. Wessex League Wimborne had a modest record in the competition before then, having never ventured beyond the Third Round, but they embarked on a spectacular Vase journey that took them all the way from the First Round to The Final. A goal down after 14 minutes at Wembley, the Dorset side fought back to win 5-3.

The Vase Final returned to Wembley in 2007 and a record 36,232 fans saw Truro City beat AFC Totton 3-1 after being a goal down.

Kirkham & Wesham of the North West Counties League lifted The Vase in 2008 in their very first season in the competition, beating Lowestoft Town 2-1.

Then in 2009, two first half goals sent The Vase back to Whitley Bay, who won it seven years earlier, as they beat Glossop North End. Bay's manager Ian Chandler also scored the winner in the 2002 victory over Tiptree United at Villa Park.

NON-LEAGUE NEWS

A West Country Round-Up provided by Tim Rawlings



Apart from Minehead's 3-3 draw at Mangotsfield Reserves there were only a handful of other matches played last Saturday in the Errea Somerset County Premier Division. The only unbeaten record in the Division held by Stockwood Green perhaps rather surprisingly went as they went down 1-0 at a Winscombe side who had not previously managed a win. Jack Barnes and Danny Copeland were on target for Shirehampton as they shared the points in a 2-2 home draw against third placed Nailsea United. A young Bridgwater Reserves side showed plenty of promise but eventually went down 1-0 at home to mid-table Glastonbury Town whilst our neighbours Watchet Town moved to within a point of Minehead by beating bottom club Brislington Reserves 4-1 away from home. An own-goal on 15 minutes followed by a second-half Louis Allen hat-trick contributed to the red and blacks second win of the campaign.

There were few surprises in the Premier/Division One Cup as Ashton and Backwell hit eight goals without reply on their visit to Timsbury. Ben Bament fired in a hat-trick, John Pugsley a brace and further goals from Ben Garland, Chris Mountford and Tye Coleman completed the comprehensive scoreline for Ashton and Backwell. Clevedon United edged home 2-1 against visitors Castle Cary whilst Langford Rovers overcame Portishead Town by a 5-1 margin. Weston St Johns formerly of the Western League progressed to the next round with an impressive 4-0 win over fellow Division One outfit Saltford.

Some of the region's teams were competing in the F.A. Cup First Qualifying Round on Saturday. Sherborne Town of the Toolstation Western League First Division recorded a

notable 3-1 win at Wimborne Town, a result which takes them into the next round for the first time in their history. First-half goals from Rico Wilson and Steve Burton sent the visitors on their way but Paul Roast pulled a goal back for Wimborne on 54 minutes. Substitute Tony Cunningham made the game safe for Sherborne by scoring with his first touch after 77 minutes. The F.A. Cup clash in Bristol between Almondsbury Town and Bristol Manor Farm ended all square as the teams fought out a 1-1 draw. Carl Rutter put Manor Farm ahead following a defensive mix up before David Anyinsah netted for Almondsbury to ensure a Tuesday replay. Willand Rovers fought bravely but eventually went down 1-0 at Frome Town thanks to a Perrott effort. Danny Jee was also sent off in the 39th minute for the visitors following a late tackle on Cheeseman. Bitton were beaten 3-2 at home against Hellenic League opponents Old Woodstock despite taking a 15th minute lead through Mark Salter. The visitors then strode into a 3-1 lead before Brandon Barnes fired a second goal for Bitton. Former Blues striker Sean Kenny was on target for Bridgwater Town but it was to no avail as they were crushed 8-2 by a rampant Truro City side. Stewart Yetton netted a hat-trick, Barry McConnell a brace of penalties and further strikes from Andy Watkins, Dan Smith and Andy Taylor on his 100th appearance completed the rout for the Cornishmen. Tiverton Town have once again made an early exit from the F.A. Cup following a 2-0 replay defeat at Paulton Rovers. Rob Claridge netted twice for Paulton Rovers in the first-half this followed Saturday's 1-1 draw at Ladysmead.

I was amongst the 288 spectators present at Wordsworth Drive to see Taunton Town attempt to pull off a surprise result by beating

Weymouth. The Dorset side enjoyed a fairly comfortable 2-1 win helped by an early goal from Warren Byerley following some poor marking from a corner. Weymouth doubled their advantage shortly after the interval when Byerley latched onto a through ball and fired home despite the attentions of several Taunton defenders. The home side did pull back an 82nd minute goal through Craig Veal following a rebounded clearance from Weymouth keeper Tom Manley but Weymouth saw out the final minutes without any real scares. There was also a shock F.A. Cup win for Mangotsfield United as they triumphed 1-0 at Oxford City courtesy of a 24th minute effort from Mitchell Page and some fine goalkeeping from Danny Greaves. For the third season running Chippenham Town knocked out hosts Banbury United at the same stage of the competition, this time by a 2-1 margin. Jason Taylor gave Chippenham the lead

on 37 minutes but Banbury equalised only for Alan Griffin to poke home the winner for the visitors just three minutes from time.

Despite taking a 17th minute lead through Chris Luxton, Bodmin Town went down 4-1 at home against Poole Town whilst Highworth Town gained a notable draw at home against Salisbury City. Torpoint Athletic put up a brave fight before finally losing 4-2 in their home tie against Clevedon Town. The visitors raced into a three goal lead through Lewis Ellis and a double strike from George Brimson inside 57 minutes. However Torpoint fought back valiantly with goals from Darren Veale and Josh Grant before a Kyle O'Donovan strike sealed the result for Clevedon on 75 minutes.

THE STORY SO FAR.....

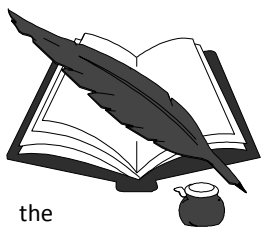
Minehead Football Club was originally founded in 1889 and spent their early years in local competitions. They entered the Western League at the start of the 1924/25 season, but after Division 2 had diminished to just 8 clubs returned to the Somerset Senior League for 1928/29, remaining in the league until WWII. After the hostilities the club enjoyed success in firstly the North Devon Senior League, followed by the East Devon and Exeter League, returning to the Western League ranks for the 1949/50 season. The club turned semi-professional in 1950/51 under former Exeter City captain Steve Walker, and in the late fifties became one of the strongest forces in the league under the guidance of Bristol based Ron Gingell. Though they remained in the Western League for 23 seasons, in spite of being one of the most consistent teams in the league, Minehead never actually won the Western League Championship, although they finished as runners-up twice (in 66/67 and 71/72).

They joined the Southern League in 1972, finishing 5th in Division One (South). The following season saw them improve slightly by finishing 4th, followed by 3rd in 74/75. In the 75/76 season the club improved yet again to carry off the league title as champions, plus winning the Southern League Merit Cup by scoring more goals than any other club in the competition (all 3 divisions). Andy Leitch lead the charge with 36 goals, (the highest tally recorded while Minehead were a Southern League side), closely followed by Jimmy Jenkins and Derek Bryant who both managed 30. The next season, the most successful in it's roller-coaster history, saw Minehead finish as runners-up to Wimbledon, as well as reaching the 2nd Round Proper of the FA

Cup for the first time, when they were beaten 2-1 by Portsmouth at Fratten Park, witnessed by more than 16,000 spectators. At this stage the club were considered to be amongst the top 6 non league clubs in the country, reflected by being invited to represent England in the Non League Anglo-Italian Cup competition during 1978. Having won both matches at home, Minehead lost both return matches in Italy, one of which was against Udinese. Within a few short years Udinese had progressed through to the Italian 1st Division, with their ground being chosen as a venue for the World Cup finals in 1990.

More history was created the following season when striker Andy Leitch found his name in the record books by scoring in 6 consecutive FA Cup matches, equalling Jeff Astle's record. Leitch had a scorching header hooked off the line with the keeper beaten during Minehead's 2nd Round Proper tie at home to Exeter City, which would have given him the record outright. Minehead were beaten 3-0 by the Devon club, a tie which attracted the club's second highest home attendance of 3,050.

Though the club were still a cup force to be reckoned with, their stunning strike partnership of Leitch, Jenkins and Bryant parted company. Struggling to score goals they were relegated from the Southern League Premier Division, finishing 17th of 20, just one point from safety. However the name had been put firmly on the non league map. On the occasion of the Southern League's centenary year (1994) manager Bob Boyd was chosen as one of the top one hundred managers in it's history, where his name stands proudly alongside such names as Malcolm Allison, Ron Atkinson and Barry Fry.



The 79/80 season saw a restructuring of the non-league pyramid, with the "creation" of the Alliance Premier League (now the Conference League). The Southern League, losing 13 clubs in the switch, opted for a Midland/Southern divide. Minehead competed in the Midland Division, and after leading the division from January, finally finished as runners-up to Bridgend. Season 80/81 saw them finish 12th, however the club were starting to experience financial problems, and the decision was made to withdraw from the Southern League at the end of the 82/83 campaign.

Back in the Western League, the team were brought back to reality with an 8-0 thrashing at Frome Town on the opening Saturday of the new season. Relegated to the First Division in 1989, the following year saw things get progressively worse, finishing bottom of the lower league. With no relegation that season, the blues lived to fight again, and the following season manager Andy Hodgson led a locally based team to the First Division Championship, gaining a record number of points. Teenage striker Gareth Morgan scoring 44 times in 40 appearances, which remains a Western League record for the club.

Further off the pitch problems soon hit the club and in the 93/94 season with 6 points

being deducted the side were relegated again, staying in the First Division until 98/99 when they won the championship. Their only league defeat came in the final match, away to neighbours Ilfracombe, having been presented with the trophy several games earlier. The high point of this season again being a lethal strike partnership, this time between Nick Woon, Gareth Morgan and Jason Charlesworth. All three appearing in the Western League's top six scorers, with over 30 goals each.

On their arrival back in the Premier Division finances had dried up, with many of the successful team moving on. Woon stayed, and was again amongst the top scorers in the league, however his goals alone could not prevent the side finishing bottom, avoiding relegation due to a restructuring of the league. The club were relegated the following season however, and languished near the bottom of the First Division ever since.

At the end of the 2009-10 season the club finished ten points adrift at the bottom of the table, and having flirted with relegation for several seasons were relegated into the Errea Somerset County League Premier Division. Robbie Hopkins remains in charge with Paul Newbold as his assistant as the club looks to re-establish itself and to build again for the future.

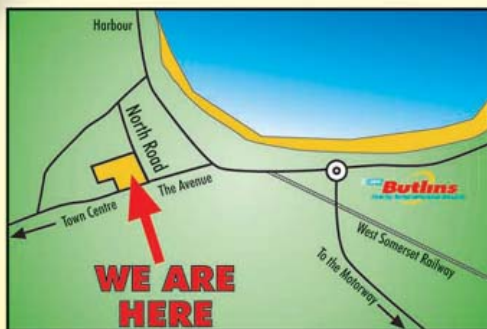
